

APPLICATION PROCESS

1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

It's important for international students to carefully review the specific admission requirements of the university and program to which they are applying, as these can vary significantly.

Overview of admission requirements:

- Documents to confirm the citizenship of a European Union third-state
- For Bachelor Programs Baccalaureate diploma or its equivalent (check if your high school diploma is recognized in Annex 1 of the Admission Methodology);
- For Master Programs Undergraduate diploma or its equivalent;
- For PhD Programs Master diploma or its equivalent;
- For study programs in which the teaching process is conducted in Romanian, a language proficiency certificate at the minimum B1 level or graduation of the Romanian Language Preparatory Year.

We advise you to contact the university's International Students Office for further guidance and clarification if needed.



REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

2. APPLICATION AND REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Application of non-EU students to POLITEHNICA Bucharest is made through the Apply platform. This involves various steps including the submission of application forms, uploading required documents, and providing necessary information for admission. The online registration system facilitates a more accessible and streamlined process for international students who wish to apply and join our academic programs.



How should your documents be uploaded:

🗸 Scanned documents in PDF format

 \sim Clearly label each file with your name and the type of document (e.g., John_Doe_Transcript.pdf). This helps in organizing and processing your application.

Citizens with dual citizenship, including the Romanian one, must follow the admission procedure dedicated to Romanian citizens organized by the NUSTPB faculties. They will be enrolled to studies as Romanian citizens, according to the current law.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Bachelor Studies

- \checkmark Application form;
 - Statement of documents authenticity;
- Consent for processing personal data;
- Declaration of commitment to pay the tuition fee;
- Copy and legalized translation of the birth certificate if the original is not issued in Romanian, English or French:
- National Identity Card or any other document proving the permanent residence (home address);
- Copy of the passport (must be valid minimum another 6 months after you applied);
- Copy and legalized translation (at the relevant authorities in the issuing country) of the high school diploma or equivalent:
- Copies and legalized translation of the transcripts of records for high school diploma if the original is not issued in Romanian, English or French;
- Copy and legalized translation of the certificate of passing the high school baccalaureate (for current-year graduates) if the original is not issued in Romanian, English or French;
- Certificate of completion of the Preparatory Year of Romanian Language or a certificate (TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge, DELF TCF, GOETHE) attesting their knowledge of Romanian / English / French / German language with a minimum B1;
- Medical certificate (translated into a language widely spoken internationally) attesting the current health \checkmark condition of the applicant and the potential antecedents regarding chronic affections. The medical certificate should contain information indicating the current health status;
 - Power of attorney, if the application of the candidate is carried out by a representative and the passport of the representative.

For Master Studies, you will also need:

- Copy and authenticated translation (at a public notary) of the Bachelor's diploma or equivalent;
- Copies and legalized translations of the transcripts of records for the Bachelor's diploma if the originals are not issued in Romanian, English or French.





PhD Studies

- Application form;
- Statement of documents authenticity;
- Consent for processing personal data;
- English or French;
- \checkmark Copy of the passport;

- with a minimum B1:

Copy and authenticated translation of the birth certificate - if the original is not issued in Romanian,

Copy and authenticated translation (at a public notary) of the Bachelor's diploma or equivalent;

Copies and legalized translations of the transcripts of records for high school diploma, Bachelor's diploma and Master's diploma - if the originals are not issued in Romanian, English or French;

Certificate of completion of the Preparatory Year of Romanian Language or a certificate (TOEFL, IELTS, ✓ Cambridge, DELF, etc) attesting their knowledge of Romanian / English / French / German language

Approval of the prospective supervisor/coordinator of the thesis (National University of Science and Technology Politehnica Bucharest) does not automatically provide a thesis supervisor);

Medical certificate (translated into a language widely spoken internationally) attesting the current health situation of the applicant and the potential antecedents regarding chronic affections. The medical certificate should contain information indicating the current health status;

Power of attorney, if the application of the candidate is carried out by a representative and the passport

3. OBTAINING THE LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE

Obtaining the letter of acceptance from POLITEHNICA Bucharest is essential for international students. These are the necessary steps to follow in order to receive it:



Bucharest Campus and Pitești Campus will verify the applicants' files and ask for further information if necessary (check email);



If your files are acceptable, we will submit them to the Romanian Ministry of Education (the minimum period for processing the application is 60 days);



If the Ministry of Education approves your application, you will receive from us the official Letter of acceptance;



Next step is to confirm the place within 20 days (September-October) by paying the tuition fees in advance for one year. (*Please check the Practical Guide for Non-EU students)*;



The Office for Non-EU admission will issue a document confirming the payment, necessary for completing the file for obtaining the study visa.

*Failure to pay the tuition fees will automatically result in the loss of places which will be filled in by the next candidate.

*Change of study field, extension/suspension of doctorate and re-enrolling request the approval of the Ministry of Education and a new letter of acceptance.
